What are Countable Nouns?

Definition

Things we can count - one, two, three...

Features

- Can be singular or plural
- Use: a/an, numbers, many, a few

Examples

- an apple
- two apples
- three books
- five students

What are Uncountable Nouns?

Definition

Things we cannot count - we measure them instead

Features

- No plural form
- Use: some, much, a little

Examples

- some water
- a little sugar
- much milk
- some rice

Countable Nouns - Examples from Daily Life



I bought three **apples** at the market.



She has two **cats** and one **dog**.



There are five **students** in the classroom.



I need four **eggs** for the cake.



He drinks two **cups** of coffee every morning.



We have many **books** in the library.



She bought a few **pencils** for school.

Uncountable Nouns - Examples from Daily Life



She drinks a lot of **water** every day.



I need some **milk** for my coffee.



He eats too much **sugar**.



We have a little **rice** in the kitchen.



Can I have some **bread**, please?



There is much **information** on the internet.



She listens to a lot of **music**.

Containers and Measurement Words

We use containers and units to measure uncountable nouns. These "measure words" act like containers or units that help us quantify uncountable items!



I drink a bottle of water every day.



She wants a cup of tea.



Can I have a piece of cake?



We need a loaf of bread for dinner.



He bought a kilo of rice.



I have a glass of milk.



She made a bowl of soup.

Quantifiers: How Much? How Many?

Understanding quantifiers is key to correctly expressing amounts in English. Let's look at some common ones and how to use them with countable and uncountable nouns.

Quantifier	When to Use It	Example Sentence
Some / Any	Use with both countable and uncountable.	I have some apples and I have some water.
Much / Many	Much for uncountable, Many for countable.	much sugar and many books.
A few / A little	A few for countable, A little for uncountable.	a few apples and a little sugar.
A lot of	Use with both countable and uncountable.	a lot of apples and a lot of water.

Interactive Activity 2: What's in Your Fridge?

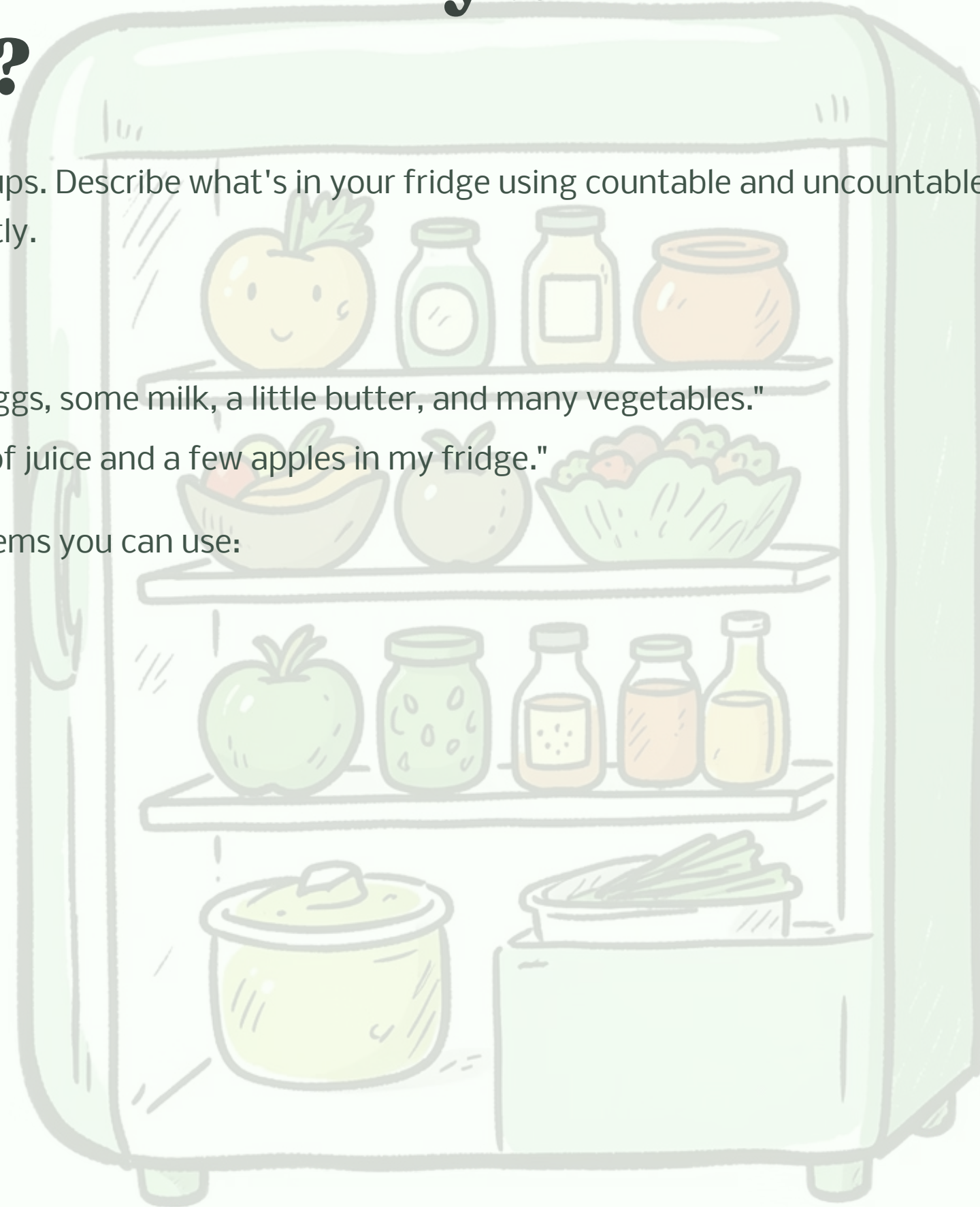
Work in small groups. Describe what's in your fridge using countable and uncountable nouns. Use quantifiers correctly.

- "There is a lot of juice and a few apples in my fridge."

Common fridge items you can use:

- eggs
- milk
- butter
- cheese
- vegetables
- fruit
- juice
- water
- yogurt
- meat
- fish
- bread

Summary: Key Points to Remember

1

Countable nouns = things we can count (apple, book, student)

2

Uncountable nouns = things we measure (water, sugar, milk)

3

Use 'a/an' with singular countable nouns

4

Use 'some' with both countable and uncountable nouns

5

Use 'many' with countable, 'much' with uncountable

6

Use measure words for uncountable nouns (a glass of water, a piece of cake)

7

Cevap: (c) much - burada "time" genel anlamda sayılamazdır, bu yüzden "much" kullanırız ("many" sayılabilir isimler için kullanılır ve "some" cümleyi olumlu hale getirir)
